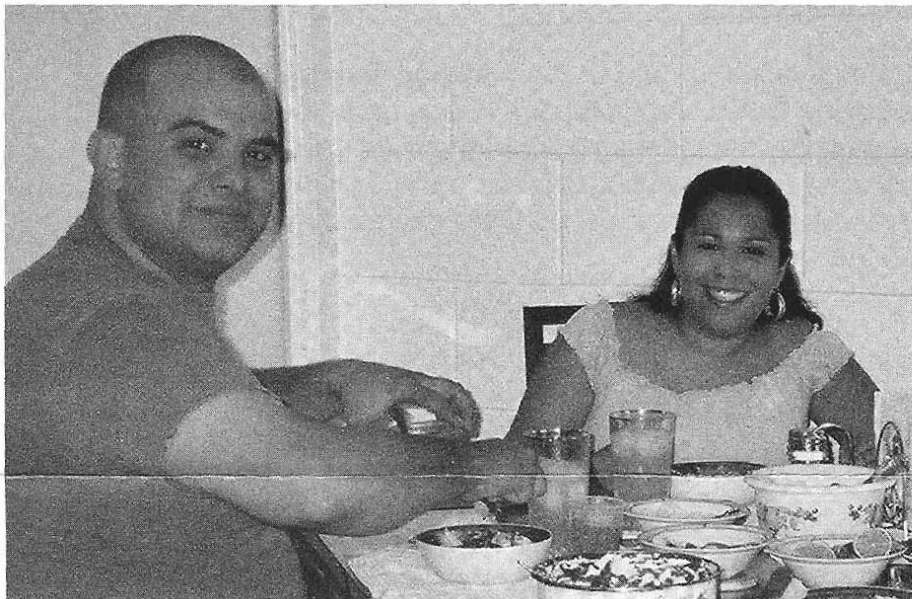

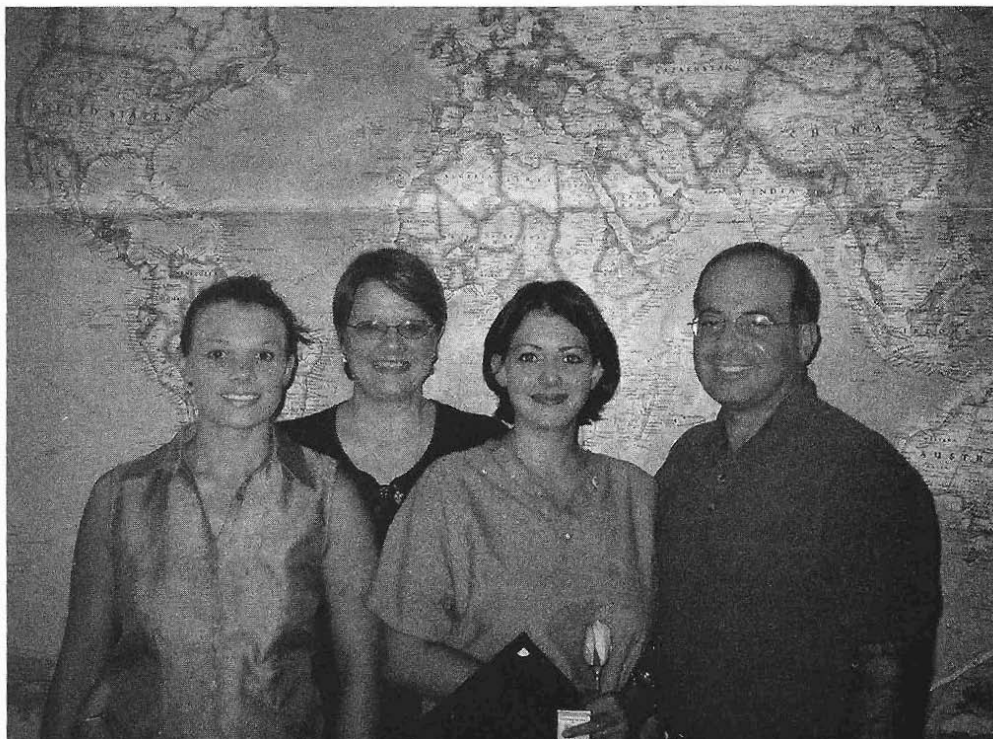


Houston-Texas, So what's new on the home front? I'm glad you asked. I will start with the oldest of our children.

also plans to take college courses while serving in the military. I count it a great honor to have children that are patriotic.

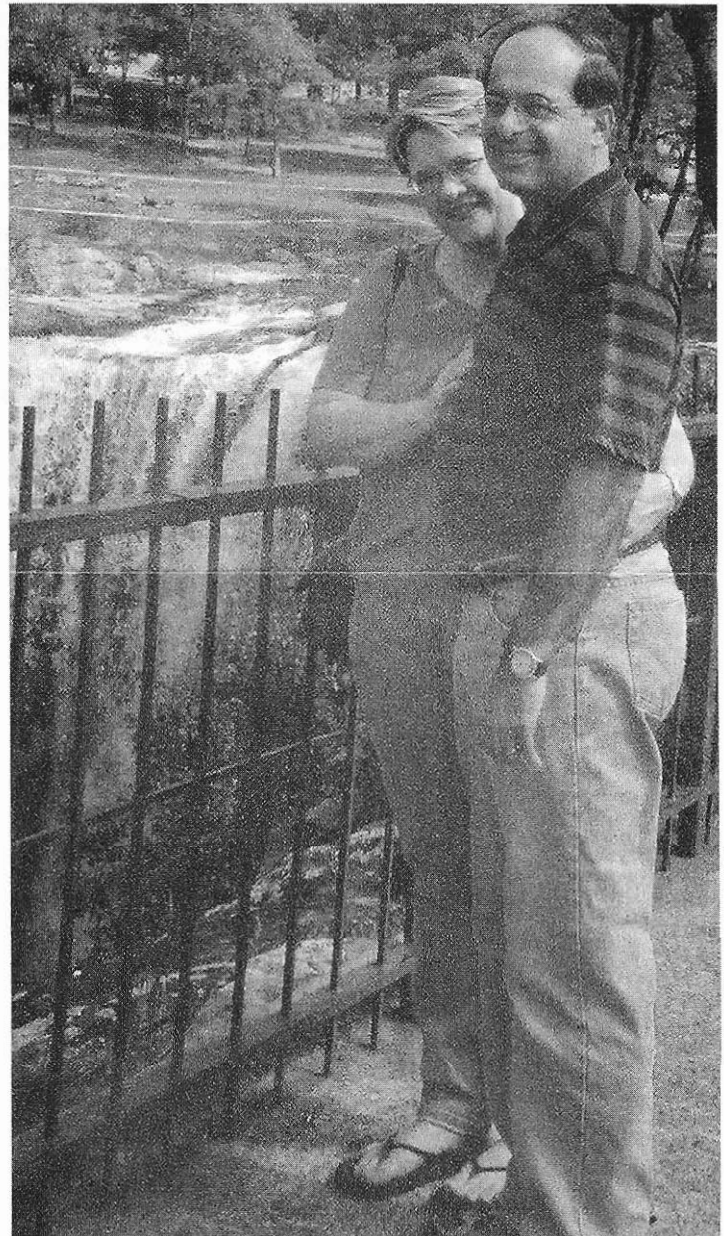
