

Dear Friends,



I saw again that life is temporal, and that some things in life, like the rebuilding of that city, do not occur overnight, but a devastating crisis may leave scars for many years.

Our conference speaker was Dr. David Shibley, Missions Director for Larry Lea's Church On the Rock. He really ministered to us. Personally I felt the Holy Spirit doing a deep work in my life. The first man I spoke with was named Miguel, a man in his 50's. Twenty days from the time I met him he was found beaten and robbed. His skull was fractured and his jaw broken. I could feel his loneliness, pain and rejection. We wept together as I shared the Gospel (with Eric's help in translating where needed). He embraced, with sincerity, Jesus Christ as his Savior.

The next day we prayed for the sick children. As we began to minister to them mothers would beg us to come and pray for their own. It is difficult to express in words the condition of many of the children..their listless faces with sunken eyes, their shaven heads, swollen lips, and the I Vs running into their arms. There were two sessions with the Christian young people singing choruses for the children who were able to come out to the lobby. The faces of their parents showed their fatigue and fear. As the children sang, many parents broke down and cried to hear the messages of hope. The Gospel was preached, and almost all in both sessions prayed to receive Christ as Savior (approximately 100 souls).

Those of you who are praying and making it possible for us to be here, are the unsung heroes and heroines that someday will be openly and publicly rewarded for your secret service to these needy children and their families.
