
VENEZUE



How can a country so rich, be so poor? Venezuela has one of the largest known oil deposits in the world as well as huge quantities of coal, iron ore, bauxite and gold. Yet in this resource rich country, up to 85% of Venezuelans live in poverty in shanty towns, the most infamous of which sprawl over the hillsides around the capital, Caracas. Few Venezuelans have gained from its wealth. The oil boom largely benefited the middle class, but the subsequent collapse of world oil prices condemned many of this class to poverty while eroding the living standards of the already impoverished.

A culture of non-accountability has combined with official corruption and political appointments in state-owned industries and government bureaucracies to produce a cumbersome, inefficient and poorly-maintained public sector and public services. In 1998 Venezuelans elected Hugo Chavez, a former army officer who promised to eradicate corruption and reform the public sector. But political unrest and deep divisions have characterized the president's term in office. His supporters and detractors staged street protests, and a general strike called by the opposition left the oil-reliant economy reeling.

As Mr. Chavez grew more powerful, his critics said he was leading Venezuela towards a Cuban-style authoritarian government. He was also criticized for courting countries which attract US or international disapproval, namely Cuba, Iraq and Libya. In 2001 he introduced controversial economic measures which gave rise to mass protests and strikes. This climate of chaos has left this rich and beautiful country destitute and hopeless.






