The Lord graciously helped me to locate a small third floor apartment to rent. Hot water heaters are rare in the town of Manzanillo, most homes in the area do not have one. This apartment has a hot water heater! Isn't God good? Please note our change of address.

EQUIPMENT UPDATE

In faith we have purchased a 1978 Plymouth van for \$2000. Including the cost of repairs and insurance, the total expenses of the work vehicle is about \$3000. We have received \$600. which brings the balance to \$2400 needed at this time.

The Sony HP 32 VHS projector we mentioned before is no longer being marketed and cannot be found. After days of investigation, we found a projector which will meet the ministry needs, and we have ordered it. We were able to secure the VCR projector at a wholesale price of \$2395 (retail \$3500). So far \$1233 has been donated which leaves a balance of \$1162.

We are also in need of a 1500 watt generator which will allow us to minister in places that do not have electricity.
