Our Vida pastors and their families are each in their own trench war during the Covid-19 pandemic. The battle is not only to survive but also to advance the cause of Christ. Pastor Pedro continues to distribute food relief packages to the families of the children who attend our children's programs in the Dominican Republic while also supplying our mission in Haiti. Our Haitian Pastor Isaac Royer's family had all their earthly goods carried off while they were away from home. We have intervened in this tragic situation and have helped them to make corrective measures to improve their particular circumstance.

Pastor Javier and Betty have valiantly advanced the construction of their second floor of their church in Ixtapa little by little. Their congregation has sold Bibles and Christian merchandise to their communities in order to help raise funds. It has been a slow but steady process. Pastor Javier recently retired from secular employment and now receives a small pension, but he returned to work cutting grass commercially to care for his aged mother and to help sustain the ministry.

In the Puerto Vallarta area one of our young Pastors, German Olvera who also is a M.D. contracted Covid-19 while working in the hospital. He and his wife Valeria have been in quarantine recuperating. He immediately began taking hydroxychloroquine, antibiotics and cold medication. They are both recuperating well and he is hoping to return back to work soon.Pastor Paco and Alicia are battling health issues and a personal economic crisis. Pastor Paco gains his livelihood as a Uber Driver. Because Mexico City is on strict Covid-19 lockdown, he is only making about \$4 dollars a day. Besides ministering to the congregation that meets on his roof top, Pastor Paco is very active preaching and ministering thru music around the city in orphanages,

in drug rehab centers, Alcoholic Anonymous events, and on social media.

Pastor Juan and Rosy in Puerto Vallarta have been working very hard helping hundreds during this pandemic. They now believe it is time to purchase property to construct a church facility. The financial difficulty of paying rent during an economic down turn has led them to begin to look for property on which to build. They will need approximately 30 thousand dollars. I am pleased that they sense the need to build their own facility. Please pray for their supply.
