Sweeping away the rain water before the children come.

When it rains, we get wet. Shelter is a primary need human beings long for; to feel safe and to stay healthy. Pastor Luis Miguel and his family live under an asbestos roof which is common in low income housing. They breathe in the asbestos fibers when the roof gets baked by the scorching sun. When it rains, water filters through the asbestos and condenses on the ceiling. It then drips down on them while they're sleeping in their beds or moving about the house. Five gallons of oil paint could seal the roof. It wouldn't take much to improve the quality of life for this dear Mexican pastor and his family. Their oldest daughter's keyboard has rusted out from the moisture in their home; leaving the church without an organ.

The monthly meeting of the Pastor's Association of Puerto Vallarta was held in our mission church at the dump. The ladies fixed Ceviche on Tostadas which were crunchy until it began to rain. The rain came down in every direction and we huddled under sections of the makeshift roofing; a combination of corrugated metal sheets and plastic tarps. I was to share that evening about our Video Bible School, "Vida Internacional". I placed an umbrella over the TV and DVD player hoping to play a promotional video, but I was warned that the electronics must first dry out before we could turn them on. So, I must wait another month to complete the presentation. We anticipate several churches will soon begin training with us.

The Church needs a roof. Pastor Luis Miguel and "yours truly" are the new construction crew. We are doing what we can with what we have to work with. We ran out of funds and have laid off the brick mason and his helper. These children and their families, living on the fringes of society need to worship in a dry place. It will take approximately \$3,000 to pay for the cement and labor in order to "dry in" the building. We can, and we will make this happen by the grace of God. I believe that He who has begun a good work at the city dump in PV will complete it. *Let's just do it!!*
